SUMMARY

Generator bids were opened for the Fire Station on Friday, March 23rd at 11 a.m. The low, responsive bidder is Cummings, Inc., located in Renton, WA for the amount of \$32,807.14.

The project consists of procuring a generator and 2 automatic transfer switches for future installation at the Fire Station. This does not include installation cost.

SUMMARY

Bids were opened on April 4th, 2018 at 11:00 a.m., for the 5-way Intersection Project. The low, responsive bidder is Colacurcio Brothers, located in Blaine, WA for the amount of \$843,065.00.

The project will convert the intersection of East Fairhaven Avenue and Cherry St/Cascade Hwy to a stop controlled, 4-way intersection. North Cherry Street will be closed and a pedestrian plaza will be created. Additional features include low-impact development stormwater measures, landscaping, sidewalks, curb extensions, lighted bollards, street lights and asphalt overlay.

Motion to award bid and authorize Mayor to sign agreement with Colacurcio Brothers for construction of 5-way intersection project.

SUMMARY

A supply bid was opened for street lighting (bollards) associated with the 5-way intersection project on Friday, March 30th at 11 a.m. The low, responsive bidder is Ameron Pole Products, located in Everett, WA for the amount of $\frac{$74,560.65}{}$.

A separate bid was published for the street lighting bollards. This allows for a direct purchase from the manufacturer, and expedites their fabrication and delivery.

We anticipate installation of these 30 bollards to occur in June of this year. They will be installed at the intersection of Cherry St and Fairhaven Ave by the contractor. Reimbursement for this expenditure will be provided by the State through the grant award for the intersection project.
