SUMMARY

Washington State law prohibits the City from amending the comprehensive plan more than once per year and requires that all proposed amendments be considered together and adopted at the same time. The City is also required to provide an opportunity for interested parties to propose amendments to the comprehensive plan. Upon receiving such a proposal the City must decide whether or not the proposal warrants further consideration. If the City decides the proposal warrants further consideration it is added to a list of proposed amendments. This list is known as the annual review docket. Items on the annual review docket are reviewed by staff and the planning commission and presented to the City Council for final action at the end of the year.

Adding a proposed amendment to the annual review docket is not a decision on the merits of the proposal and does not mean it will be approved or rejected. By adding an item to the annual review docket the City Council authorizes the Planning Commission and Planning Department to perform further analysis and present a recommendation for approval or rejection at the end of the year.

RECOMMENDATION

The Planning Commission has recommended the City Council adopt the annual review docket and authorize the Planning Department and Planning Commission to further evaluate the comprehensive plan amendment proposed by I-5 Burlington LLC.

SUMMARY

The City of Burlington entered into an Interlocal Agreement earlier this year with Skagit County to fund the Skagit County Department of Emergency Management's provision of certain emergency management services. **Section 3. Term of Agreement** specifies that, with the consent of the County, the Agreement may be extended for two years (2019 and 2020) upon written request of the city. This notice was due June 15, 2018.

RECOMMENDATION

Move to authorize the Mayor, or his designee, to notify the County of the City's desire to extend the existing Interlocal Agreement for a period not to exceed two years, or if the County does not agree to extend the existing Interlocal Agreement, to enter into negotiations for a replacement Interlocal Agreement, the terms of which would be reviewed and authorized by Council at a later date.
