SUMMARY

Last summer the Library hosted the first very successful Touch A Truck event, no street closures were needed. This year's event, which is scheduled for Tuesday, August 14, 2018, has expanded and is a collaboration between the Library and the Parks and Recreation Department. It is included as one of the Pop-up Programs events. The event will span Washington Avenue from Anacortes Street through to S. Skagit Street and will encompass the library, Parks and Recreation building and Maiben Park. To date, the Burlington Police, Fire, Streets and Parks departments as well as the Children's Museum, Skagit Transit, and Dike District 12 have committed to participate. The apparatuses will be parked along Washington Avenue between the blocks of S. Skagit Street and Holly Street.

AirLift NW has also committed to land a helicopter at Maiben Park for the event providing the air ambulance is not needed for critical care. Erica Littlewood with the Fire Department has been coordinating this very cool addition. If the helicopter is able to be a part of the event, the landing zone is in Maiben Park and the Fire Department will be taking the lead on supervising the landing zone.

The event has expanded in size this year requesting the following street closures: 1.) Close E. Washington Avenue between S. Anacortes Street and S. Skagit Street (adjacent blocks to thru traffic); 2.) Closure of the alleyway bordering the library on the west between the intersection with E. Washington and E. Vernon Avenues; 3.) Close roadways by 8:30AM and reopen at 2:00PM.

RECOMMENDATION

Council Motion to approve the street closures and helicopter landing zone for the 2018 Touch A Truck Event and authorize the Mayor's signature on appropriate documents.
