#### **SUMMARY**

On October 20, 2017 the City of Burlington received an application from I-5 Burlington LLC requesting that the zoning of a site located on the west side of I-5 be changed from C-1 (General Commercial) to C-2 (Heavy Commercial). In accordance with Washington State law (RCW 36.70A.070 and WAC 365-196-640(1)), the City's zoning and comprehensive plan maps must be consistent with one another. Because the C-1 and C-2 zones are associated with different comprehensive plan designations this request also requires a corresponding amendment to the comprehensive plan map. Accordingly, the applicant is also requesting that the comprehensive plan map designations applicable to their property be changed from C-B (Commercial Business) to HC-I (Heavy Commercial Industrial) in order to ensure the zoning and comprehensive plan maps are consistent with one another.

The Planning Commission reviewed the proposal at a Public Hearing on November 21, 2018. The Planning Commission received testimony from surrounding property owners concerning a lack of public notice, noise from heavy vehicle "back-up beepers" and public address speakers. The Planning Commission declined to make a recommendation on the proposal.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

As detailed in the attached staff report, the Community Development department finds no reason to reject the applicant's request and recommends that Council approve the proposed amendments to the City's zoning and comprehensive plan maps.

## **SUMMARY**

In the 2017 session, EHB 2005 (RCW 35.90) passed requiring three actions by cities with business licenses and local B&O taxes. The law:

- 1. Requires cities with business licenses to establish a workgroup to create a model business license with a licensing threshold by July 2018 for adoption by all business license cities by January 1, 2019;
- 2. Requires all cities with business license to administer their business license through the state's Business Licensing System (BLS) by 2022 or File Local by 2020; and
- 3. Establishes a task force on local B&O tax service apportionment under RCW 35.102.130 to report to the Legislature by October 2018.

The City is required to adopt language for businesses under a certain threshold that do not maintain a place of business in the City. City staff has determined that a business license exemption for any person or business whose annual value of products, gross proceeds of sales, or gross income of the business in the city is equal to or less than \$2,000 is consistent with the City's needs and resources. An ordinance was proposed to reflect that change, and was adopted September 27, 2018.

Additionally, section 5.04 of the Burlington Municipal Code must be amended to allow the City to utilize the State's Business Licensing Service (BLS) as required or pursuant to the needs of the finance department, which is attached..

### **RECOMMENDATION**

Motion to recommend amending BMC Section 5.04 in accordance with RCW 35.90.

## **SUMMARY**

The City of Burlington has contracted with Kailin James to provide criminal prosecution services on a yearly basis since approximately 2014. Ms. James and City Attorney Leif Johnson divide criminal prosecution duties based on a variety of factors that may fluctuate in any given week. Since 2015, the number of municipal court calendar days and potential trials per month has generally increased, and the City continues to be under public defense review.

The proposed contract, attached, is identical to the contract from 2018. It is important that Ms. James is available for public defense access as much as necessary, and this contract should continue to support that goal. City Attorney Leif Johnson plans to continue to participate in criminal prosecution at the same level that was exercised in 2018.
