SUMMARY

Attached is quote from Pape Machinery for a Skid Steer (compact track loader) to be utilized by the Street department. This item has been identified and approved in the capital facility plan for the Street Department, and budgeted within the ER&R fund for 2018.

Staff reviewed cooperative purchasing bid documents through the National Joint Powers Alliance (NJPA) for Skid Steers. Pricing and brands were also compared to contracts from the Washington State Department of Enterprise Services (State Contract). The lowest pricing was from Pape Machinery through NJPA (Contract 032515-JDC) for the preferred Skid Steer.

Burlington Municipal Code allows for cooperative purchasing in lieu of advertising for bids. The Street Department looked at three different brands of skid steers (with on-site demonstrations), and this particular brand is preferred.

SUMMARY

This \$149,196 contract with Gray & Osborne will produce a bid package (design, specifications, and cost analysis) for upgrading 2 Sanitary Sewer pumps stations at the following locations:

Wastewater Pump Station 9 located at 16505 Ovenell Road Wastewater Pump Station 4 located at 331 S. Section Street

Both pump stations were constructed in 1975 and have been identified for upgrade within the City of Burlington Wastewater Comprehensive Plan, prepared by Gray & Osborne, Inc., dated December 2011. Funding has been allocated within the 402 Sewer Improvement Fund for this work.

SUMMARY

Pursuant to Burlington Municipal Code 2.28 the Civil Service Commission is to be comprised of three members, appointed by the mayor, who serve without compensation. Mr. Edmundson has served on the Civil Service Commission since February 2012. Mr. Edmundson has been a valuable member of the Commission over the past 6 years and has expressed a willingness to continue to serve on the Commission. Mr. Edmundson meets the qualification requirements prescribed in RCW 41.08.030 and RCW 41.12.030. It is the recommendation of the Civil Service Examiner to appoint Mr. Edmundson to another term of service on the Civil Service Commission.

SUMMARY

The replacement of City of Burlington patrol vehicles is a significant expenditure and investment. With encouragement from Council and City Administration, the staff of the Police Department analyzed our vehicle and equipment replacement process. Instead of requesting 3 vehicles that had been scheduled for replacement we determined that we could purchase 2 vehicles and shift our fleet to cover the needs of the 3rd vehicle. We estimated that we could purchase and equip 2 vehicles for \$100k. 2018 brings a significant change as we are requesting the purchase of 2 Ford Sport Utility Vehicles instead of the customary Chevrolet Tahoe.

We sought a quote from the local Ford dealer but were told that they would not be able to offer a quote as another dealer won the State award. The State bid for the Ford SUV is \$34,203.45 dollars per vehicle including tax. The install and purchase of equipment is quoted at \$14,351.49 dollars per vehicle. The purchase of a vehicle and necessary equipment totals \$48,554.94 dollars per vehicle (\$97,109.88 for 2 vehicles).

Other incidentals will include the striping/marking of the vehicle, radio purchase/installation and licensing.

RECOMMENDATION

Authorize the purchase of 2 Ford Sport Utility patrol vehicles and equipment package in the amount of approximately \$97,109.88 dollars.

SUMMARY

The replacement of BPD handguns has been planned and discussed since at least 2015. Current side arms have served us for 10-12 years and need to be replaced. Over the last year or so, the department conducted a thorough examination and tested multiple firearms before determining that a Sig Sauer 9mm firearm would become our issued firearm.

BPD firearm instructors worked with the Sig Sauer Company and determined that Adamson Police Products is the regional distributor for Sig Sauer law enforcement issued firearms.

We will re-purpose the magazine holders but will order new holsters. Our firearms training budget will have a small savings due to the fact that 9mm ammunition is cheaper than the 40mm ammunition we currently carry.

RECOMMENDATION

Authorize the purchase of Sig Sauer 9mm firearms and equipment with 2018 budgeted funds for an estimated amount of \$15,800.00 dollars. (\$18,000 dollars was budgeted for this expenditure).
