The Parks and Recreation Department budgeted for the purchase of new Utility Trailers in the 311-000 Parks & Rec Reserve fund for 2019. After researching the best type of trailer that will meet staff needs, purchasing two Tilt Utility Trailers is the best option. The tilt trailer is on the State Contract so the city is able to acquire them at the best price.

The new tilt trailers will allow staff to accomplish job tasks more efficiently. Mowers will be on trailers that are rated for their weight and having the trailer with the tilt function allows for easy load and unloading of mowers and equipment. Staff will surplus the two old trailers that are past their usable life and are due for replacement. By ordering the equipment in February it will be delivered and ready for use prior to the busy spring mowing season.

Attached are quotes from Maverick Specialty Flooring for flooring upgrades at City Hall and the Fire Station. The contractor will seal and wax concrete floors at City Hall for a cost of \$7,512.50 plus taxes. At the Fire Station, the contractor will grind, patch and seal the concrete flooring for a cost of \$23,555 plus taxes. The concrete surfacing is preferred by Fire staff in the common areas for its ease of cleaning, which helps keep contamination from fire-fighting activities out of the building. This will be funded by the General Capital Facility Improvement fund. Maverick Specialty Contracting was the lowest quote received.

Attached are quotes from Great Floors for work to be done at the Fire Department. The existing carpeting is original, installed in 1998. Through State Contract pricing, Great Floors will remove and replace carpet tiles at various locations (training rooms & offices) within the Fire Station. This will be funded by the General Capital Facility Improvement fund. The total cost for this work \$17,011 including taxes.
