#### **SUMMARY**

Cities have the statutory authority to charge late fees for delinquent sewer accounts as provided in Washington state law. Such authority was previously, and erroneously, ended in late 2016. We recommend the City Council re-adopt a late payment penalty to ensure fairness among utility customers. Additionally, the fee is increased from \$5.00 to \$10.00. The late fee will be effective for the first billing cycle in July 2019.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Motion to approve the proposed ordinance to add the penalty for delinquent sewer accounts of \$10.00 per month and authorize the Mayor's signature.

SUMMARY

This \$116,800.00 agreement with Gray & Osborne engineers (G&O) will provide an update to the Comprehensive Stormwater Management plan. The current City of Burlington Comprehensive Stormwater Management Plan (Plan) was last updated in 2005, and now the City is seeking professional services to revise and update the Plan and review the City's stormwater program (Program). The prior Plan was completed before the mandate from Department of Ecology requiring the NPDES permit and the City's Storm Drain Utility was recently formed. A new NPDES permit with additional reporting requirements will come into effect later this year.

This agreement will allow G&O to complete the work and assist the City with the establishment of Program goals and tools, review of operation and maintenance activities, capital project development, update of hydraulic model and review of rates and connection charges for incorporation into the updated Plan. Funding will be provided by the Storm Drain Utility.

### **SUMMARY**

Bids were opened for the 2019 Overlay Project on May 21st at 2 p.m. The low, responsive bidder is Granite Construction, located in Bellingham, WA, for the amount of <u>\$804,757</u>.

The project consists of 2-inch pavement overlay of <u>Burlington Blvd</u> between Pease Rd and Costco D AND <u>Market Place Dr</u> between the Burlington Blvd and George Hopper Rd AND <u>Peterson Rd</u> between Pulver Rd and I-5 overpass. WA State Transportation Board is funding \$210,000 for paving along Peterson Rd and Skagit County will pay for their portion of Peterson Rd as well.
