HISTORY AND SUMMARY

At our last Council meeting we discussed the possible extension of the parking lot lease at a reduced rate (original lease was for \$1,600/mo. and the renewal was offered at \$1,000/mo.) for the next 12 months to reflect the effect that COVID-19 has had on old downtown shopping. Following Council discussion, there was a consensus to discontinue the lease until the current Pandemic situation eases and shoppers return to the Fairhaven area.

I reached out to the family who owns the lot and they came come back with an offer of \$800/mo. For the next 12 months. I told them that I would bring this new offer to the Council.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED

If the lease is not renewed, the City's existing lease ends and it will be up to the family as to what happens to the lot – in all likelihood, they will close the facility to public use.

There also exists the possibility of re-engaging with the family for use of the lot in the future when shoppers return to this part of the city and need these spots to park and shop.

CURRENT AND FUTURE BUDGET RAMIFICATIONS

The City's most recent lease for the parking lot is at the rate of \$1,625.00 per month. The City incurs costs for improvements that may be needed to maintain the parking lot for safe public

SUGGESTED COUNCIL MOTION LANGUAGE

If you want to extend the lease:

"I move to approve the lease agreement for the parking lot at 423 Fairhaven Street in for \$800 month for the next 12 months and authorize the Mayor's signature."

If you do not want to extend the lease:

"I move to discontinue the lease and ask administration to inform the family that once the economic situation is better, we would discuss the City again leasing the parking lot."

HISTORY AND SUMMARY

Presidential Disaster Declaration # FEMA-4481-DR-WA COVID-19. To provide funds to the SUBRECIPIENT for the emergency protective measures taken in response to the COVID-19 pandemic outbreak as approved by FEMA in project worksheets describing eligible scopes of work and associated funding. The DEPARTMENT is the Recipient and Pass-through Entity of the Presidential Disaster Declaration # FEMA-4481-DR-WA COVID-19, and FEMA State Agreement, which are incorporated by reference, and makes a sub-award of Federal award funds to the SUBRECIPIENT pursuant to this Agreement. The SUBRECIPIENT is accountable to the DEPARTMENT for use of Federal award funds provided under this Agreement and the associated matching funds.

Funding will help offset the costs associated with the response. For eligible expenditures, the City will be reimbursed for up to 70% of the claim. YTD expenditures are approximately \$60,000. Eligibility of expenditures and total amount of claim/funding is to be determined.
